TRIUMPH SWEEPS IRELAND SPORTS CAR RALLY

One of the most amazing victories in the history of Triumph was turned in at the Circuit of Ireland International Car Rally in early April. Six Triumph TR's ran away with the show when they took six of seven top places in the general classification and all six won top spots in the grand touring class. In the over-all competition, the TR-3 team won first, second and third places and also took fifth, sixth and seventh against competing cars from the British Isles and other nations. This was the first year the Rally was sanctioned by the F.I.A. The Triumph team also walked off with the Team Prize. Triumph has always shown brilliantly in this event, having taken top honors on three previous occasions and the Team Prize for three consecutive years.
