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## NEW TRIUMPH CARS -

Along with the news that the TR-3 sports car has received a face-lift for 1958, comes the word that two new cars have been added to the Triumph family. A new 40 h.p. Sedan and an Estate Wagon have joined the Triumph line at your dealer.

The new Sedan and Estate Wagon get as much as 40 m.p.g. and both models have distinctive operating features. Available early in the Spring, both models will have a newly designed push-button clutch atop the gear shift lever, manually operated to eliminate faulty gear changes and make engine stalling impossible. The Gold Star engine offers a cruising speed of 65 m.p.h. and a maximum speed of 78 m.p.h.

The Estate Wagon, priced at \$1,899 in the East and \$1,979 in the West, has an all steel panel body, four wind-up windows and a full size rear door giving easy access to the storage area. There are 38 cubic feet of stowing space when the car's rear seat is folded down. This model is 12 feet long over-all.

The compact Sedan seats four people comfortably and also has a fold-down rear seat which when folded expands the 12 cubic feet of stowage room to 38 cubic feet. The price of the Sedan is \$1,699 east of the Mississippi and \$1,749 in the West.

Individual front suspension insures a comfortable ride plus safer handling on curves. A full line of accessories and parts is available through Triumph dealers.
