Here We Go Again -

Here's some more good news about recent Triumph victories. Down in Florida, John Floyd swept the field to take 1st over-all in the Miami Sports Car Club Gymkhana held May 15th. In the second event, John also took 1st place. There were 36 entries in this event. The Miami SCC, by the way, has a busy calendar of events going on all the time and we appreciate their keeping us informed.

There's a TSOA member by the name of David Hebb who seems to be able to put 26 hours of activity in an ordinary day. David works for CBS and admits he is operating under "forced draft" by teaching, writing, directing and entering every event he can possibly find time for on weekends. He is editor of the LISCA NEWS (Long Island Sports Car Association), a frequent contributor to sports car magazines and an inveterate rallye man with his Triumph. Among his most recent successes are taking 1st in a Jaguar Owners Club rallye in Westchester, 4th in the LISCA Invitational Cerebral Palsy Rallye (out of 85 entries), and 2nd in the 3rd Annual Rallye Delaware Valley (Delaward Sports Car Club) which covered 270 miles from 8:30 p.m. one day to breakfast the next. Some 50 cars were involved in that one. Besides frequent phone calls to keep up our morale, David is probably trying to learn how to type with his right hand while driving his TR2 with his left.

California reports that on May 15th, in Santa Rosa, the Triumph, in competition with sports cars of four times its cost, put on a tremendous show. Out of a field of 40 competitors, 33 of which were in the largest classes (D,C,B), the Triumph placed 4th overall and 2nd in Class. In the 1400-3000cc race for novice and senior drivers, the Triumph took 1st and 3rd in class, the Doretti 2nd in class.

Again in California, on Memorial Day in the Santa Barbara Road Races, Pay Sawyer and her TR2 walked off with 1st over-all in the Ladies Event, and Wally Kieckhefer, driving a Triumph took 2nd in Class in the Main Event, running 2nd only to a Ferrari.

At the Steamboat Springs Road Races in Colorado, a Triumph driven by Fay Myers streaked across the finish line of the Main Event, a strong 2nd in Class, 4th over-all.

Before we get off the subject of competition results, we urge you to let us have the details of any successes you might have - and just as soon as possible after the event. Perhaps you are a bit shy about this when you view the major victories the Triumph has racked up in the big international competitions (more than 250 in 18 months), but that would be a mistaken inferiority complex. Each and every success is important to us and that includes yours. So be sure and let us know all the details.
