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# TRIUMPH SALES HEADED UP!

LEONIA, N. J., June 4—A 53 percent increase in the retail sales of Triumph sports cars was reported here today by British Leyland Motors Inc. The May, 1971, total of 2,432 was an all-time record for the month.

Combined sales of the four Triumph models, the TR-6, Spitfire, GT-6 and Stag, for the first five months of 1971 were 38 percent ahead of the January through May period last year. The 1971 five month figure was 8,418 compared to 6,098 last year.

The May increase follows a 24 percent jump recorded in April.

British Leyland President Graham W. Whitehead attributed the Triumph sales increase to the make's continuing popularity plus increased productivity in the United Kingdom. "In the past," he said, "Triumph sales have been severely limited by the availability of cars. We have now turned the corner on supply, thanks to improved labor relations and additional plant capacity, and are looking forward to 1971 being a record-breaking year for Triumph."
