

The 1960 Triumph Rally group assembled near the Olympic Stadium in Rome.


### TR-4 RALLY OF EUROPE ANNOUNCED



## TRIUMPH AT SEBRING

George Waltman of Great Neck, L.I., returned to the "good old days" of sports car racing by entering and driving a strictly stock TR-4 in the recent Sebring 12 Hour Race in Florida.

The Triumph George drove was one of the very first into the country, was thrashed extensively by magazines and newspapers in road tests and used by Standard-Triumph as an executive car. It was sold to Genser-Forman (Waltman's employers) in early March. They immediately loaned the car to George for his Sebring entry.

Not much time was left before the race to prepare the car so Waltman tightened all nuts and bolts, installed competition shocks, removed the bumpers, installed extra lights, took a compression check on the engine and was ready for the big international race. Nothing else was done to the car.

Since it was a modest effort, Waltman and his co-driver Nick Coné, piled all their luggage and spare parts into the car and drove to Sebring (they had no pit car or spare parts truck). They drove to Sebring from New York in 27 hours and averaged 29 mpg on the highway.

Once at Sebring, they unloaded all their debris at the motel and were passed through tech inspection. The muffler and air cleaners were left on, new spark plugs were installed, the tires pumped up to 35 lbs. all around and out they went for 15 laps of practice each. George taped up a broken generator wire and pronounced the car ready for the 12 hour grind.

Since no other cars were entered in Class 11 with the Triumph, the race officials combined Classes 11 and 12. This little move gave Waltman and Coné the headache of competition with the 6 Ferrari GT's, led by World Champion Phil Hill and Olivier Gendebien.

Waltman got off to a beautiful start, well up in the field. The TR-4's best lap was 4:18 but the car was driven conservatively at 4:24 throughout the race. In the late afternoon, Waltman had to stop to replace a broken pushrod (this took 10 minutes) and at one time the throttle linkage came unhooked for Coné. Other than these major catastrophies, the sturdy Triumph cruised around, needing nothing more than an occasional driver change and gas.

The checkered flag came down at 10 p.m. and the Triumph had covered 154 laps to Phil Hill's 196 (GT Ferrari). Only three of the Ferraris were in front of the Triumph, one was behind and the other had retired. Waltman and Coné had averaged 69.89 mph (including stops), the TR-4 yielded 14 miles per gallon and used less than one quart of oil for the 12 hours of racing.

They then re-packed the car and drove back to New York, amazingly, still on the same set of Michelin X tires that they had when they left (better than a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch tread still remaining all around).

It is doubtful that any other car in the race matched this Triumph performance, strictly stock and with no race preparation. A fine performance, proving Triumph reliability and a credit to George Waltman and Nick Coné for a very nice job of driving.

# TR-4 SCORES IN 1962 MONTE CARLO RALLY

The privately entered TRIUMPH TR-4 of Thuner and Gretener of Switzerland finished 2nd (over two liter class) in the rugged winter endurance rally, the 31st running of Rallye Automobile Monte-Carlo. The only car ahead of the Swiss TR-4 was a Factory entered Austin Healey 3000. In addition, Thuner scored the third fastest time of all entries in the speed test around the famous Monte Carlo Grand Prix race circuit.
